Earth's Greatest Wildlife Destination

STARTING AT \$15,550 | 100 TRAVELERS | LEADERS: TED CHEESEMAN +14

Experience the vibrant spring of South Georgia Island and the early season of the Antarctic Peninsula. This is the only time of year you can find southern elephant seal bulls fight for territories, gray-headed albatross on their cliffside nests, and wandering albatross young attempting first flight. The early season in the Antarctic Peninsula is when penguins are courting, building nests, and perhaps laying eggs. We offer the most in-depth exploration of one of the densest wildlife spectacles found in the world, and with only 100 participants, you'll have ample opportunities to experience this spectacle during every landing and Zodiac cruise.



Golden Hues on Spectacular Landscapes

STARTING AT \$13,450 | 100 TRAVELERS | LEADERS: TED CHEESEMAN +14

Since explorers discovered this continent, stories of incredible vistas and abundant animals have captured the imagination of the adventurous. Take advantage of warm, golden light for photography, delight in whale aggregations gorging on krill, and watch penguin chick antics. Icebergs, in many shades of blue and carved into fascinating shapes by weather and water, are prime photography subjects. Our priority is to give you the maximum time in nature during a unique period on the Peninsula and to share our passion and experience in the Antarctic. The solitude amid these landscapes will endlessly captivate you, so come share this adventure with us!



Five Island Circuit

STARTING AT \$10,350 | 8 TRAVELERS | LEADER: HUGH ROSE

Visit five different islands, the best of Patagonia and Antarctica combined into one. Trek through the most diverse wildlife habitats in the Falkland Islands. With two days on Steeple Jason Island — a place very few have the opportunity to stay — take time to sit quietly alongside the black-browed albatross colony and watch as they take off, land, court, and preen each other. Take in the abundant colonies of gentoo, king, and rockhopper penguins, explore Sea Lion Island, the most species-rich site in the Falklands, and witness Magellanic penguins ride the surf in to the beach to waddle to their underground burrows.



Canadian Arctic Adventure

STARTING AT \$12,250 | 24 TRAVELERS | LEADER: TED CHEESEMAN

Immerse yourself in Canada's Arctic wilderness to experience one of the world's largest beluga whale gatherings. Spend six full days at a remote camp at the Cunningham River estuary, where you will explore the high Arctic's landscapes and wildlife by bike, kayak, ATV, truck, and on foot, choosing your activity each day. Discover a dynamic ecosystem 500mi north of the Arctic Circle amidst this rugged scenery, with possibilities of polar bears foraging along the shorelines, ringed and bearded seals swimming amongst the pack ice, arctic fox pups playing in the grasses, and so much more!



#### STARTING AT \$11,270 | 8 TRAVELERS | LEADER: HUGH ROSE

Spend days immersed with polar bears and Alaska's other iconic wildlife, and nights photographing the magical aurora borealis. Travel through the picturesque Brooks Range, decorated in fall colors, to the stark vastness of the Arctic Coastal Plain. Discover an Inupiat island village where polar bears feed on whale carcasses, while they await the formation of the winter sea ice. Absorb the hypnotic, dancing curtains of color across the night sky from the ephemeral phenomenon of the aurora borealis. Learn wildlife, landscape, and aurora photography techniques and see nature's beauty at its finest with one of Alaska's best naturalists and photographers.



Realm Of The Polar Bear

Sail through Norway's Arctic past glaciers lit by the midnight sun to find a most mythic predator: the polar bear. This polar adventure is to the famed Svalbard Archipelago of northern Norway. This region remains wild and pristine with its vast mountains, dramatic fjords, massive glaciers, and picturesque icebergs coupled with iconic Arctic wildlife. Choose between a I4-day trip in June-July or a 20-day trip in August-September, both with only I2 participants and professional photographer Scott Davis and naturalist guides.



Portraits of Wild Africa

Explore woodlands to arid plains, rivers, and lakes, and take in sweeping views of highland and lowland landscapes. Experience top-quality lodging, knowledgeable guides, and an adventure that Cheesemans' has perfected over 30 years.



Quest for Island Endemics

Focus on endemics such as charismatic lemurs, chameleons, and birds in this hotspot of diverse ecosystems. Our 24-day tour provides the perfect opportunity to get to know this island's unique species well. This special itinerary caters to the pace of nature lovers and photographers offering several days in each special habitat to enjoy these incredible landscapes and their animals. Virunga Mountains of Rwanda

Their enormous size, extraordinary strength, and the deep, lush mountainous environment have contributed to their mystique. Only about 900 mountain gorillas remain in the wild, giving you a special opportunity for this rare experience. These social apes and their large appetites may have you observing youngsters playing, the silverback eating by stripping leaves from huge branches, friendly grooming between pals, or tiny babies nursing from their mother. You will walk away with unforgettable memories and amazing photographs.



Desert Dunes and Wildlife


Travel to Namibia, South Africa, and Zambia to capture remarkable moments with professional photographer Scott Davis. Explore regions with incredibly accessible biodiversity including Africa's Big Five (lions, elephants, rhinos, leopards, and buffalo) and many beautiful birds in South Luangwa National Park and Sabi Sand Private Game Reserve (part of the Greater Kruger National Park system). Discover the picturesque red sand dunes and salt pans of Sossusvlei in the Namib Desert. Encounter nocturnal wildlife and stargaze during evening game drives. Visit some of the best sites to photograph southern Africa's quintessential wildlife and its iconic landscapes.



Migration and Predation

February is green on the Serengeti — a perfect safari backdrop for lions, cheetahs, and leopards as they stalk prey. While zebras, giraffes, and gazelles nurse their young and newborn wildebeest calves frolic on the plains alongside their mothers, predators skulk in the fresh grasses. Elephants drink among the baobab trees, flocks of storks dot the plains searching for insects, and oxpeckers feast on small insects on giraffes. Watch cheetahs with frisky cubs and leopards hunting along the river corridors. With only four participants per vehicle, our stretch, pop-top Land Cruisers provide 360° views for wildlife viewing and photographic opportunities.



Primate Encounters

#### STARTING AT \$14,500 | 7 TRAVELERS | LEADER: SCOTT DAVIS

This special great ape expedition submerses you in the fascinating world of the rare and elusive mountain gorillas and chimpanzees. With special access permits in Kibale National Park, immerse yourself among chimpanzee families for two-and-a-half days, witnessing and photographing intimate moments while chimps wake up, groom, forage, interact, and play. Spend two days seeking iconic African animals in Queen Elizabeth National Park. Delve into Bwindi Impenetrable Forest for three days, and trek to locate and observe mountain gorillas feed, socialize, parent, and trudge through the forest. Close encounters with our nearest ancestors will leave you with a sense of awe and wonder.





Guadalupe Island, Mexico

#### STARTING AT \$3,800 | 24 TRAVELERS | LEADER: SCOTT DAVIS

Sail to Guadalupe Island for an unparalleled in-water experience with one of the world's most respected and enigmatic predators: the great white shark. With its clear blue water, subtropical temperatures, and an abundance of great whites, the protected waters surrounding Guadalupe Island are one of the absolute best places to observe and photograph these awe-inspiring animals. Watch sharks from the surface cages or in the submersible deepwater cage for the ultimate experience 30ft below the surface. With a background in marine biology and decades of field photography experience, Scott Davis is the perfect leader for this unique adventure.



Marine Mammals and Seabirds

STARTING AT \$160 | 50 TRAVELERS | LEADER: TED CHEESEMAN +3

Sail the deep-water canyons of Monterey Bay for a full day of wildlife and whale watching with marine specialists. The California Coast is one of the best locations to observe seabirds such as shearwaters, jaegers, skuas, alcids, and even black-footed albatross. Sea otters play around in the kelp forests and humpback whales often feed and breach close to the ship! Bring your binoculars to look for Pacific white-sided, common, and Risso's dolphins and perhaps even a Northern right whale dolphin or the largest animal on the planet — the blue whale.



Essence of Winter

STARTING AT \$6,900 | 8 TRAVELERS | LEADER: TOM MURPHY

Capture images of snowy Old Faithful geyser, ice-covered bison alongside thermal pools, foxes, coyotes, and perhaps wolves with professional wildlife photographer Tom Murphy. Step around delicate, chalky mineral terraces at Mammoth Hot Springs and discover multihued steaming pools and bubbling mud pots in the Geyser Basins. Witness small crystals form into "geyser rain" as Old Faithful erupts. Track elk, pronghorn, and red fox amidst a snowy and steamy landscape. Listen for the howls of a pack of gray wolves haunting the stillness of Lamar Valley. Delve into the heart of Yellowstone National Park to create your stories of winter survival.



Kaleidoscope of Bird Diversity

#### STARTING AT \$7.550 I 10 TRAVELERS I LEADER: PACO MADRIGAL

Lush and verdant throughout the year, Costa Rica is a fantastic place for bird lovers. This small country sustains some of the world's most productive ecosystems. Explore various tropical environments through Savegre River Valley, Carara National Park, La Selva Biological Station, and Tortuguero National Park. Spring hosts exceptional weather and more animal activity, including migrating birds along the Continental Divide, the backbone of Costa Rica, plus monkeys, sloths, crocodiles, peccaries, and agoutis. Enjoy the friendly people and delicious food at brilliantly situated lodges while you explore this Central American hotspot.



Pantanal's Big Five

STARTING AT \$13,800 | 10 TRAVELERS | LEADER: DIOGO LUCATELLI

Explore the vast Pantanal for South America's Big Five — jaguar, giant anteater, giant otter, ocelot, and South American tapir. Discover the marshes, lakes, and streams, part of a diverse ecosystem that fosters superb encounters with these awe-inspiring mammals. Journey down the famous Transpantaneira Highway to Porto Jofre where Cuiabá River cruises afford numerous opportunities to see jaguars, giant otters, and other wildlife not easily seen by land. Stay at Caiman Lodge, a top wildlife destination in Brazil, and a sure bet for giant anteaters and ocelots. Don't miss this UNESCO world heritage site and biosphere reserve of spectacular beauty!

Panoramic Patagonia

STARTING AT \$8,100 | 8 TRAVELERS | LEADER: CLAUDIO VIDAL

Patagonia is a sparsely populated, arid region with superb wildlife viewing opportunities. You'll begin your adventure outside of El Calafate, Argentina with the spectacular Perito Moreno Glacier in Los Glaciares National Park. Then you'll take in the beautiful vistas of Torres del Paine and explore the most southerly Chilean islands. Visit a colony of king penguins, view soaring Andean condors, search for guanaco herds roaming the plains of Torres del Paine, and encounter shy female pumas that are busy feeding their cubs. Soak up majestic scenery while appreciating the diversity of animals Patagonia has to offer.



Island to Andes

STARTING AT \$8,950 | 8 TRAVELERS | LEADER: CLAUDIO VIDAL

Join us on this varied South American journey. Stroll amongst the Easter Island's monolithic moai statues. Travel through Chile and Argentina seeking birds and mammals that have adapted to arid and high-elevation areas. Cruise the nutrient-rich waters of the Humboldt Current to search for seabirds and mammals. Visit the desolate alien landscape of the Atacama Desert, the lush and volcanic Lauca National Park, and the bird-rich Azaca, Chaca, and Lluta valleys. Pursue a different suite of birds in Argentina's wine country, while sampling delectable local wines. Come along for an unforgettable exploration into the history, wildlife, and sweeping landscapes of South America.



Evolution's Playground

STARTING AT \$10,995 | 14 TRAVELERS | LEADER: JUAN MANUEL SALCEDO

Sail on the most in-depth itinerary around this archipelago famous for charismatic wildlife unafraid of you or your camera. Explore Ecuador's lush cloud forest before embarking on a 15-day voyage around these Enchanted Isles. Discover endemic reptiles, tropical land birds, breeding boobies, albatross, penguins, marine mammals, sharks, tropical fish, and much more! With early and late landings, this special expedition caters to photographers and wildlife enthusiasts alike. The evolutionary story of the Galapagos Islands has been told many times but only through immersing yourself in its splendor can you truly appreciate the impressive forces that shape nature here.



On the Silver Bank, Dominican Republic

STARTING AT \$5,420 | 19 TRAVELERS | LEADER: TED CHEESEMAN

Sail to the Silver Bank, where the world's largest concentration of humpback whales converges to calve and mate. This time of year is peak breeding season, providing you with fabulous in-water encounters and whale watching. Witness males vying for the "escort" role, and slip into the water to see curious calves follow their mothers and drink their rich milk. Absorb Ted's extensive knowledge of photographic techniques and of the behaviors, anatomy, and temperaments of the North Atlantic humpback whales. Get close-up photos of surface activity like breaching, flipper-slapping, and competitive interactions. Don't miss coming eye-to-eye with whales during soft-in-water encounters.



Boreal Wilds

#### STARTING AT \$6,200 | 6 TRAVELERS | LEADER: DAVID 'BILLY' HERMAN

Tour the sparsely populated taiga in Scandinavia's Arctic to watch wolverines, brown bears, and wolves under the midnight sun. Spend four nights in photography/viewing blinds amid these mammals' territories to observe and photograph them at close range. Meander through primeval forest and vast bogs of Patvinsuo National Park, and explore Valtavaara Nature Reserve, one of Europe's best birding spots, to search for capercaillie, red-flanked bluetail, little and rustic buntings, hazel grouse, three-toed woodpecker, and gray-headed chickadee. Both photographers and wildlife enthusiasts will enjoy fabulous views of difficult-to-see mammals on this trip!

Central Australia, Kakadu and the Top End, and north Queensland Wet Tropics STARTING AT \$10,410 | 12 TRAVELERS | LEADER: TONIA COCHRAN

Explore the highlights of the Northern Territory and northern Queensland, including the Great Barrier Reef! In the Northern Territory, watch the sunset and sunrise transform Ayers Rock and Kata Tjuta. Explore Kings Canyon, Watarrka National Park, the richest botanical region in arid Australia. Spend two days in Kakadu National Park with walks, night spotting, and a boat cruise on Yellow Waters Billabong. In northern Queensland, explore Atherton Tablelands' tapestry of farmland, woodland, and rainforest. Cruise the Daintree River and spend a day snorkeling the Great Barrier Reef. Join Tonia as she leads the group throughout these rich wildlife areas of Australia.



Lamington National Park, Kangaroo Island, and Tasmania STARTING AT \$10,220 | 12 TRAVELERS | LEADER: TONIA COCHRAN

Begin with spectacular Lamington National Park where close encounters with the resident wildlife will include amazing views of crimson rosellas, king parrots, satin and regent bowerbirds, as well as endemic marsupials. Visit Kangaroo Island for remarkable scenery and wildlife, including koalas, echidnas, sea lions, a host of new birds, and of course, kangaroos. Explore Tasmania at Bruny Island, Cradle Mountain, and Mount Field and Narawntapu National Parks to find charismatic wombats, wallabies, and pademelons, as well as the endangered forty-spotted pardalote and other Tasmanian endemic birds. Join Tonia as she leads the group throughout these rich wildlife areas of Australia.



Snorkel and SCUBA Dive Micronesia

#### STARTING AT \$11.850 | 14 TRAVELERS | LEADERS: SCOTT DAVIS AND MACSTYL SASAC

Snorkel and SCUBA dive amongst tropical islands in the western Pacific Ocean on our voyage through the newly created Palau National Marine Sanctuary. This unique expedition explores the more well-known, easily accessible snorkel and dive sites, plus the remote and seldom-visited Southwest Islands of this world-renowned archipelago. Explore the World Heritage Rock Islands Southern Lagoon where tropical-forested karst islands meet coral caves and lakes with non-stinging jellyfish where you may snorkel. Explore some of the most diverse reefs on the planet, learn about the ecology of Palau's fish and reefs, and experience the unique culture of the people of the Southwest Islands.



Snorkel the Coral Triangle's Hidden Gem

STARTING AT \$8,930 | 17 TRAVELERS | LEADERS: BENJAMIN KAHN, JOHANNES HENNICKE, AND WAYNE SENTMAN

Snorkel these vibrant waters with colorful coral reefs rich with iridescent fish, shimmering tropical lagoons, and jungle-clad volcanic islands. Residents still maintain a subsistence lifestyle, so the region has been unchanged for hundreds of years. With a diversity of wildlife, observe nudibranchs, pipefish, pygmy seahorses, mantis shrimp, rays, sea turtles, and sharks. Enjoy two to three snorkeling excursions a day, complemented by visits to intriguing cultural villages and invigorating jungle hikes. Join us on this expedition in partnership with the Oceanic Society and Planet Deep to snorkel and explore one of the most biodiverse marine ecosystems in the world: the Coral Triangle.



Spirit of the Himalayas

#### STARTING AT \$9,325 | 10 TRAVELERS | LEADER: HISHEY TSHERING

Discover this most scenic and nature-rich region situated on the edge of the vast Himalayan range. Join the quest for the rare black-necked crane, white-bellied heron, vibrant pheasants, acrobatic langurs, and more. This mountainous gem between India and China engulfs you in Bhutan's strong culture, not only in its unique architecture and abundant prayer flags, but also in its adoration and respect for nature. Visit dzongs and monasteries, including a hike to the famous cliff-side Tiger's Nest Monastery. Experience the wonder and beauty of Bhutan through the eyes of our Bhutanese leader, Hishey Tshering.



Primates of the Ancient Forest

STARTING AT \$10,440 | 8 TRAVELERS | LEADER: CHARLIE RYAN

Explore an island with pristine ecosystems, home to charismatic and rare wildlife and one of the oldest rainforests in the world. Visit an orangutan sanctuary where these charming gentle giants feed and socialize. Take in breathtaking views atop the rainforest canopy while watching birds weave their way through the foliage. Cruise the Kinabatangan River with pygmy elephants bathing along its riverbanks, and visit Mount Kinabalu's diverse habitats and incredible diversity of flora and fauna, including 18 endemics. Participate in game drives and jungle walks through various habitats to observe orangutans, Bornean gibbons, proboscis monkeys, maroon langurs, and so much more!



Especially Tigers!

STARTING AT \$11,750 | 10 TRAVELERS | LEADERS: SCOTT DAVIS +4

Explore India's famous wildlife reserves and national parks as you seek magnificent tigers, many other mammals, and beautiful birds. Soak in India's wildlife for six days in Ranthambhore National Park and five days in Bandhavgarh National Park. Our comprehensive tour also visits cultural marvels at the famous Taj Mahal and the Khajuraho Monuments en route from Ranthambhore to Bandhavgarh. You also visit Keoladeo Ghana National Park at Bharatpur, a unique wetland wildlife preserve where you ride in rickshaws around the bunds (embankments). While our focus is on tigers, you will have lots of opportunities to see other wildlife!



Trekking & Tracking

Discover Nepal's majestic, towering Himalayas and its unique lowland wildlife such as tigers, rhinos, elephants, and sloth bears. In the Annapurna region, spend three days of moderate, porter–assisted trekking at elevations between 3,000ft and 7,000ft through enchanting forested river valleys, while dining and sleeping at mountain lodges. Game drive in Bardia and Chitwan National Parks in the lowlands to experience Nepalese mammals, reptiles, and birds. Our leader Tashi Tenzing has been trekking in the Himalayas and leading wildlife safaris since the late 1980s, including successfully climbing Mount Everest three times, so it is sure to be an epic adventure!
