EXTENSION OVERVIEW

Discover Mkomazi National Park, a conservation success story and beautiful landscape that few visitors to Tanzania's Northern Safari Circuit even know about. Only 11 elephants survived in the area in the 1980s, but today, a thousand or more wander through this landscape. This is a birding paradise, and you will have a chance to see wintering birds from Eurasia, as well as many beautiful resident species. The park has only one small, permanent camp in the park, so you will have the privilege of wildlife viewing without hordes of competing tourists. This is wild Africa at its finest!

HIGHLIGHTS

- Explore a diverse landscape of mountains and valleys with acacia-commiphora woodlands punctuated by magnificent baobab trees.
- Thrill at the chance to observe large populations of elephant, eland, zebra, hartebeest, and buffalo, as well as healthy populations of predators like lion, leopard, and cheetah.
- Discover many arid-adapted species such as southern gerenuk, fringe-eared oryx, and lesser kudu.

- Watch for special birds, such as vulturine guineafowl, eastern yellow-billed hornbill, various sunbirds, and unusual starlings (e.g., Golden-breasted, Shelley's, and Fischer's).
- Visit repatriation programs for endangered African wild dogs and black rhinos.

TRIP OPTION: This is a post-trip extension to our Tanzania trip from February 2 to 17, 2023 (<https://cheesemans.com/trips/tanzania-feb2023>).

LEADERS: Walt Anderson assisted by three local guides.

DAYS: Adds 4 days to the main trip to total 19 days, including estimated travel time.

GROUP SIZE: 12.

COST: \$5,320 per person, double occupancy, not including airfare, singles extra. See the Costs section on page 4.


ACCOMMODATIONS: Permanent tent-cabins with interior bathrooms set on a hillside with dramatic views to the west.

Walt Anderson

Walt is one of the pioneers of ecotourism, having led expeditions in Africa, North and South America, and Australia for many years. He led the first World Wildlife Fund trips to Madagascar and the first ecotours from the US to the national parks of Brazil; his deepest international experience is in East Africa. Walt is an author, photographer, wildlife artist, and lecturer whose love for the natural world is conveyed with humor and enthusiasm. He was Professor of Environmental Studies at Prescott College in Arizona for 27 years and

is the author of two books on California's Sutter Buttes and a major chapter on ecotourism in *International Wildlife: Contemporary Challenges in a Changing World*.

Augustine Mwangotya

Augustine, founder and owner of our local safari operator, studied at Tanzania's College of Wildlife Management and served with the Tanzania Wildlife Department, developing an invaluable set of connections and knowledge. DETAILED ITINERARY

Feb 16 ~ Drive to Mkomazi

After lunch in Arusha, enjoy the changing scenery as you proceed east to Moshi at the foot of majestic Mt. Kilimanjaro, then southeast to the Pare Mountains and the entrance to Mkomazi National Park on the border with Kenya. You will enjoy vervet monkeys and colorful birds at the park entrance, then observe birds and mammals in the lush landscape until reaching Babu's Camp on the west slope of one of the small mountains here. Settle in to savor the sunset and enjoy some bush luxury and a friendly staff.

Feb 17 ~ Explore Mkomazi National Park

Near your camp is Dindera Dam, which creates an oasis that attracts thirsty wildlife, especially in the dry season. You may see elephants, giraffes, eland, zebra, kongoni, and other herbivores, as well as some of the carnivores looking for a meal. The lake also hosts storks, waterfowl, shorebirds, and much more. A bush breakfast near the lake will provide exciting wildlife-observation opportunities and delicious sustenance. You will discover endemic bird species here that you would not have found elsewhere in your Tanzania travels.

Feb 18 ~ More exploration of Mkomazi National Park

Today will involve a leisurely game drive through the park to visit a center where captive breeding programs and releases have had remarkable success in restoration efforts for endangered black rhinos and African wild dogs. This is a special opportunity to see conservation in action, and the site is a great place to see hyraxes, yellow baboons, colorful lizards, and flashy birds. The park also hosts the elegant fringe-eared oryx, the spiral-horned lesser kudu, the shy red duiker, and the bizarre long-necked gerenuk, whose Swahili name, swala twiga, means "giraffe-antelope." In the evening, you will share highlights of your adventures and toast your incomparable driver-guides.

Feb 19 ~ Morning in the park and drive back to Kilimanjaro area

Your final morning will have another memorable game drive, looking for any of the special animals you may have missed. Previous guests have rated this park visit as one of the most memorable of their safari experiences, and considering that you go to Ngorongoro Crater and the Serengeti, both World Heritage Sites, that is high praise indeed. You'll drive back through Moshi to the Kia Lodge for relaxation, optional birding on your own, and preparation for departure at nearby Kilimanjaro International Airport.

Feb 20 ~ Arrive home or continue on our Mountain Gorilla extension

Cancellations are non-transferrable. No refunds are given after the Final Payment due date.

Included

- All leaders, park entry fees, and permits for all activities unless described as optional.
- Fees for visiting endangered African wild dogs and black rhinos repatriation programs.
- Accommodations for the nights of February 16 through February 18 and a dayroom on February 19.
- Meals from dinner on February 16 through lunch on February 19.
- Mineral water during game drives.
- Coffee and tea during meals.
- Transfers via complimentary hotel airport shuttle from Kia Lodge to the Kilimanjaro International Airport, regardless of departure day.
- Trip Materials – information about flights, packing, entry and departure requirements, airport transfers, gratuities, etc.
- Short-term AMREF Flying Doctor medical emergency evacuation insurance. This does not include hospital or treatment costs. For more information see www.cheesemans.com/travel-insurance.

Not Included

- All airfare, airport and departure taxes, and excess baggage fees. Round-trip airfare is approximately \$870 to \$1,800 between the US and Kilimanjaro, Tanzania.
- Passport and visa fees.
- COVID tests.
- Gratuities – tipping is always discretionary. However, we suggest budgeting about \$25 to \$30 per participant per day for February 17 to February 19 with our leaders (about \$75 to \$90 total per participant).

Fitness Level

Most days consist of early mornings, game drives on bumpy roads, and long hours in nature that require good energy levels. Walking is limited, mostly around the camp and at the wild dog center. Drive to and from Mkomazi is about three hours, though you will have a rest break. Please contact us if you have any health concerns that may make this trip challenging.

Flights

Airfare is not included in trip costs. Detailed logistical information and the contact information for our recommended flight-ticketing agent are included in the Trip Materials we will send you. Please let us know if you are arriving earlier or staying later as we are happy to assist you with any extra overnights that you might want to arrange.

Flights you (or a travel agent) book: Arrive at Kilimanjaro International Airport (JRO) near Arusha, Tanzania, by February 3. Depart from Kilimanjaro International Airport (JRO) on the evening of February 19. **If you are continuing on our Mountain Gorilla extension**, see the *Flights* section in its itinerary for departure information.
