SAFARI OVERVIEW

From the grandeur of Victoria Falls to the truly untamed corners of Hwange National Park, encounter the glory and reality of Zimbabwe. Safari on private concessions where you will share wildlife sightings only with others from our small camps and lodges. Enjoy the proximity and flexibility to, at a moment's notice, jump in a Land Cruiser and rush to watch a lion's sunset hunt. Spend time in the villages bordering the park, and not only see the positive impact of ecotourism, be a part of the solution for human-wildlife conflict. Visit and learn about the water pump project funded by your trip in remote Southern Hwange, where few people travel, and therefore, less investment filters in to benefit the local people and to protect the wildlife.

HIGHLIGHTS

- Witness the splendor of one of the world's natural wonders: Victoria Falls.
- Dwell amongst elephants, lions, buffalo, and more in lodging set in the action.
- View thirsty wildlife up close from custom "look-up blinds" located feet from freshwater pumps the elephants love.
- Experience the thrill of walking alongside white rhino and meet the team that protects this threatened species.

DETAILED ITINERARY

Sep 9-10 ~ Travel to Victoria Falls from home

Sep 11 ~ Arrive in Victoria Falls, Zimbabwe

Welcome to Zimbabwe! Our local agent will provide transfers from the airport to the hotel. If you would like to arrive earlier, we can arrange divergent airport transfers and extra nights. Join the group and your leader for dinner at the lodge.

Sep 12 ~ Tour Victoria Falls, then off to Northern Hwange Spend the morning viewing, from different vantage points, the awe-inspiring Victoria Falls, the largest in the world by volume, but not by size. Still, the enormous falls measures 360ft high and 5,306ft wide. You will see why in the local language Victoria Falls is known as Mosi-oa-Tunya — "the smoke that thunders."

Transfer halfway by road (2 ½ hours) and game drive the rest of the way to Nehimba. Arrive in time for a walking safari, then have sundowners and dinner on the deck of the lodge as the elephants gather just steps away for their evening drink.

Sep 13-14 ~ Explore Northern Hwange

Enjoy game drives and walks where mopane woodlands merge with the Khalahari sandveld. Meet many elephants and hopefully the elephant-hunting lions the area is known for! Stop for bush lunches or return to camp for a midday break. The dry season provides rich opportunities to encounter diverse wildlife as animals drink and play at the waterholes and the famous Nehimba Seeps, a sacred ancient water source once used by the San huntsmen. The area is frequented by elephants digging for nutritious minerals in the water. Take time to engage with the camp staff; you will be captivated by their excitement about the elephants' visits to the Nehimba waterhole, even though

they come every day! Travelers and staff never tire of watching these intriguing and social giants!

Sep 15-16 ~ Discover the remote African bush

Take a charter flight to the incredibly remote Jozibanini, 4 hours from the next nearest camp. In addition to providing an authentic African bush experience, the existence of Jozi, a 5-tent rustic camp, provides the presence and resources to quell poaching in this previously unpatrolled and unprotected part of the park. After a day walking or mountain biking the elephant paths and game driving far from all other civilization, witness the Milky Way as you never have before. You can even roll your beds outside and sleep under the stars if you choose! Though the least luxurious of all your lodging, this camp is most often heralded as the favorite.

Sep 17 ~ Game drive to Bomani and visit pump project

View more exciting game as you travel towards Bomani, stopping along the way at a remote village to learn about the pump project funded by your trip. With no natural water source in the dry season, the people and animals of Hwange are 100 percent dependent on water originally pumped by windmills, later replaced by diesel engines, and now solar power. The safari lodges build and maintain all the wells, and thanks to you, another much needed one will be in service in an often-overlooked village.

You will arrive at Bomani in time for sundowners at one of the favorite pans in Ngamo Plains before a 3-course dinner under the stars.

Sep 18 ~ Experience the Ngamo Plains

Check off each of the Big 5 from your list as you explore the plains surrounding Bomani. Encounter Cecil the Lion's descendants and other big cats, like leopards and cheetahs, as well as traditional favorites such as giraffes, zebra, buffalo, and of course, more elephants. Don't discriminate; appreciate your time with the Ugly 5 (wildebeest, warthogs, hyenas, marabou storks, and vultures) too!

Sep 19-21 Between game drives, visit the local village and rhino project

Wake up early for game drives, then be immersed in Zimbabwean culture. Join village children on their walk to school and get a glimpse into their lives. Listen to their songs and walk through their classrooms. Stop by and meet the Head Man of the community and learn about how he seeks to blend progress and traditional cultural practices. Get up close and personal with the successfully reintroduced white rhinos and their guardians, the "Cobras." Tour the medical clinic the village voted to finance with money generated by rhino encounters. Because the safari lodges are built on public lands, the communities have a voice in the development funded by the lodges. Enjoy games drives, the "look-up blind," and unbelievable sunsets as the days wind down.

After one last game drive or walk, board the custombuilt, open-air train car on what was once the longest straight rail line in the world. The elegant and comfortable Elephant Express provides unrestricted game viewing. Enjoy drinks of all kinds and delicious snacks en route!

Upon arrival at your luxurious lodging in Victoria Falls, take a breath and enjoy views of the Zambezi before a sundowners' cruise and a lovely dinner.

Climate

September is well into the dry season in Hwange National Park. The average lows are in the upper 50's°f, and the average highs are in the upper 80's°f. Rain is unlikely.

Fitness Level

Good energy levels are required for long days in the field riding in bouncy Land Cruisers. You will also have the

Accommodations

Nehimba and Bomani have rustic, but luxurious accommodations, while Jozibanini is more basic but comfortable. All lodging has electricity and flush toilets.

• The one-way flight from Giraffe Springs to Libuti is included in the trip cost. **Important**: this flight has a strict luggage allowance of 44lbs (20kg), included carry-on, and dimensions no more than 11.8in by 13.8in by 27.5in (30cm by 35cm by 70cm). Also, soft luggage is required.
