SAFARI OVERVIEW

Embark on an unforgettable journey through **Torres del Paine National Park**, one of **Patagonia's** most stunning wilderness areas. This pre-trip extension takes you through awe-inspiring landscapes, from the towering peaks of the Paine Massif to glacier-fed lakes and sprawling grasslands teeming with wildlife. Take a scenic boat excursion to **Grey Glacier**, where you may witness massive ice calving events, and explore the park's diverse ecosystems, home to **guanacos**, **Andean Condors**, **Magellanic Woodpeckers**, and more. Springtime in Patagonia offers blooming wildflowers, dramatic cloud formations, and incredible photography opportunities, making this an ideal extension before your **Antarctic expedition**.

WHY CHOOSE THIS EXTENSION?

- **Discover the Majestic Paine Massif:** Marvel at jagged peaks, deep valleys, and pristine glacial lakes that define this UNESCO Biosphere Reserve.
- **Wildlife Encounters in Patagonia:** Spot guanacos, Andean Condors, foxes, and rare bird species in their natural habitat.
- **Exclusive Grey Glacier Boat Excursion:** Get up close to the calving ice face of Grey Glacier, one of Patagonia's largest and most active glaciers.

- **Springtime Beauty & Unique Landscapes:** Experience Patagonia in full bloom, with wildflowers, golden grasslands, and snow-capped peaks.
- **Expert-Led Small-Group Adventure:** Gain insights from a local naturalist guide, enhancing your understanding of Patagonia's ecosystems and geology.

DAYS: Adds 4 days to the main trip to total 27 days, including estimated travel time.

DETAILED ITINERARY

Oct 19 ~ Travel to Punta Arenas, Chile

Depart for **Punta Arenas**, the gateway to **Chilean Patagonia** and the starting point of your **Torres del Paine** adventure.

Oct 20 ~ Arrive in Punta Arenas

Upon arrival, meet your guide and transfer to your hotel. Optional explorations include a scenic coastal walk, **birdwatching** along the **Strait of Magellan**, or exploring the town's historic center.

Oct 21 ~ Drive to Torres del Paine National Park

During your journey to the park, you will observe how the strong westerly winds have sculpted the vegetation of the **Patagonian steppes**. En route you may find **guanaco**, a **southern relative to camels**, **southern grey fox**, and **Patagonian skunk** while enjoying your first contact with **southern beech** (*Nothofagus*) forests. You will stop several times for photography and wildlife observation along the way. You may find colorful groups of Chilean **Flamingos** on the alkaline pools and **Black-necked** and **Coscoroba Swans** on the shores of Ultima Esperanza Fjord in Puerto Natales. Driving towards the park, enjoy splendid vistas of the hilly terrain and if it's clear, of the Paine Massif in the distance. While visiting the valleys you will learn about the origins of the dramatic backdrop of Torres del Paine, one of the finest natural spectacles in Patagonia. In the evening you may do a nature walk or a sunset photo session.

Oct 22 ~ Western Torres del Paine and Grey Glacier

You will start early to view and photograph the **Paine Massif** at dawn. Today you will explore the southern and western regions of this vast national park, which comprises 600,000 acres. The omnipresent Paine Massif, a magnificent set of rugged peaks formed out of granite and sedimentary rock, dominates the landscape. You will have the opportunity to explore the southern beech forests and its diversity of plants and animals; you may find **Magellanic Woodpecker**, **Austral Parakeet** and, if you are lucky, the shy Andean deer (huemul). Take in the contrasting mosaic of towering mountains, glaciers, wetlands, steppes, and forests. Lake Grey is one of the highlights of the day where colossal icebergs are stranded on the southern shore of the lake after a long, slow transit from the glacier front.

From the southern shore you will board our boat for a 3-hour excursion through the icy waters of the lake towards the impressive and actively calving front of the **Grey Glacier**. Grey is one of the nearly 50 outlet glaciers originating from the massive **Southern Patagonian Ice Field**, the world's third largest ice cap after **Antarctica** and **Greenland**. The front is full of crevasses and the solid glacial ice colors vary from whitish to deep indigo. The glacier is flanked towards the east by impressive granite walls that are part of the Paine Massif, and towards the west by the eroded and low summits of the older Andes. You will be treated with a glass of Pisco sour or Scotch with millenary (glacier) ice. In the evening you may do a photo outing for sunset and the dramatic cloud formations.

Oct 23 ~ Eastern Torres del Paine

Venture into the park's eastern sector, home to reed-fringed lagoons and vast wetlands, supporting over **120 bird species**. With expert guidance, observe **Andean Condors** soaring overhead, **Black-necked Swans** gliding across lakes, and vibrant spring wildflowers carpeting the valleys.

Oct 24 ~ Eastern Torres del Paine and back to Punta Arenas

You will start early to photograph and view the Towers or the Horns with the first light. With the right lighting, the mountain base turns orange and the scene becomes very dramatic with peculiar lenticular clouds moving fast over the peaks. At the eastern corner of **Sarmiento Lake**, you will reach a location that commands the most incredible views of the towering

peaks of Las Torres, the pinnacles from which the park takes its name. As you move around the park, you might observe herds of **guanaco**, the curious-looking **lesser rhea**, and impressive **Andean Condors** soaring along the road. During the morning you will visit the eastern side of the park to enjoy the views of one of the impressive water falls of **Paine River** and if it's clear, of the fabulous granite columns of the Paine massif from Laguna Amarga. If you'd prefer to hike to the base of the Towers, you can opt to do this today; your hotel can provide a guide (costs extra). After your picnic lunch, you will head back to Punta Arenas.

Oct 25 ~ Join our South Georgia and Antarctic Peninsula trip

Board your next adventure, continuing onto the [South Georgia & Antarctic Peninsula Expedition](#), where the journey from Patagonia to the polar wilderness begins.

- Carbon offsets for your flights to/from this trip.
- All airfare, airport and departure taxes, and excess baggage fees.
- Passport and visa fees.
- We can arrange extra hotel nights for an extra cost.
- Gratuities – tipping is always discretionary. However, we will add a gratuity of \$120 per participant (\$30 per participant per day for October 21 to 24 for Nico, the local guides, drivers, and additional services) to your final payment.

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OTHER DETAILS

Climate

Torres del Paine is notorious for its unpredictable weather conditions, so be prepared for wind, warm sun, and sudden cold. The average temperatures in Torres del Paine in October range from about 35°F (2°C) at night to about 55°F (13°C) during the day, and rain is infrequent.

Fitness Level

You will drive to locations of interest and do some short hikes for birdlife around the fringed lagoons and other areas. The longest hike is on Lake Grey's Beach which is 2 miles round trip. The rest of the hikes are not long or strenuous and although the terrain is uneven, the routes are not steep. Please contact us if you have any health concerns that may make this trip challenging.
