Feb 22 – 23 ~ Travel to Delhi, India from home

Feb 24 ~ Arrive in Delhi

Meet our local agent for transport from the Delhi airport to the Claridges. If you would like to arrive earlier, we can arrange divergent airport transfers and extra nights.

Feb 25 ~ Delhi

Discover the rich **heritage of Delhi** with a curated itinerary that highlights the city's **Mughal architecture, bustling markets, and diverse cuisine.**

- **Visit Humayun's Tomb** – A UNESCO-listed masterpiece that inspired the **Taj Mahal**, showcasing stunning **Mughal architecture** and intricate Persian influences.
- **Explore Old Delhi & Shahjahanabad** – Take part in an **ittar-making workshop** at an 8th-generation perfumery, crafting a personalized fragrance while learning the ancient art of **natural perfumery**. Savor a classic **Old Delhi street snack** for an authentic local experience.
- **Rickshaw Ride Through Chandni Chowk** – Navigate the historic **Chandni Chowk market**, once a hub for **silver and gold traders**, and visit the iconic **Jama Masjid**, Delhi's largest mosque, known for its breathtaking **Islamic architecture**.

Feb 26 – Mar 1 ~ Bandhavgarh

Fly from **Delhi to Jabalpur**, then embark on a **4-hour drive** to **Bandhavgarh National Park**, one of India's most renowned wildlife reserves. Covering 172 square miles, this park is home to **over 25 mammal species, 250 bird species**, and boasts one of the **highest tiger densities** in India.

Stay at the **Kings Lodge**. Nestled in a serene Sal forest just outside Bandhavgarh's Tala Gate, Kings Lodge offers an ideal blend of comfort and immersion in nature. This **eco-conscious retreat** is known for its commitment to sustainability, exceptional hospitality, and prime location for wildlife viewing. Spacious cottages provide a peaceful haven between outings. The lodge's thoughtful design and practices support both conservation and community, making it a fitting base for exploring the **rich biodiversity of Bandhavgarh**. Spend **3.5 days** in Bandhavgarh, starting each morning with a wake-up call and tea or coffee, followed by **safaris in 4x4 jeeps**

with a **resident expert naturalist**. You'll have **one full-day permit**, allowing for unrestricted **exploration of the park** beyond usual zonal restrictions, including early morning and late afternoon access.

Mar 2 – 5 ~ Kanha

After a **morning safari**, drive through rural **Madhya Pradesh** to **Kanha National Park**, a 366-square-mile reserve set in the **Chhota Nagpur Plateau**. Kanha's **Sal forests, grassy meadows, and deep ravines** provide an ideal habitat for **tigers, leopards, sloth bears, barasingha, and Indian wild dogs**. The park played a crucial role in **saving the barasingha**, an endangered swamp deer, making it one of **India's most successful conservation stories**.

Stay at the **Kanha Jungle Lodge**, managed by wildlife expert Tarun, his son Jai, and Dimple, a passionate self-taught naturalist. The lodge, surrounded by **dense Sal forest**, offers an **eco-conscious stay**, blending seamlessly with the jungle. Your first evening includes an orientation on Kanha's core and buffer zones and the **success of the barasingha breeding program**.

Your days begin with an early wake-up call, followed by a **morning safari in a 4x4 jeep**, led by a **naturalist and forest guide**. Enjoy a picnic breakfast in the jungle before returning for lunch and an **afternoon safari**. A **full-day permit** grants you **unrestricted access** across all zones and routes, plus **extended park entry hours**. In the evening, interact with the Sankhala family and watch **TIGERLAND**, an award-winning documentary on **Kailash Sankhala's conservation efforts**. On March 4, we will participate in local activities that celebrate the Holi spring festival for a unique cultural experience that few travelers get to experience.

Mar 6 – 8 ~ Pench

After a **final morning safari at Kanha**, embark on a **4 to 5-hour drive** to **Pench National Park**, located in the **Satpura-Maikal region**, spanning **Madhya Pradesh and Maharashtra**. This landscape, immortalized in **Rudyard Kipling's *The Jungle Book***, is home to **tigers, leopards, wolves, Indian wild dogs, and over 300 bird species**. Named after the **Pench River**, the park is an **ecological haven** with **lush forests, open grasslands, and riverine ecosystems**, making it a **paradise for nature enthusiasts and wildlife photographers**.

Stay at **Jamtara Wilderness Camp**, featuring **ten luxury tents with panoramic jungle views**. A highlight of your stay is the **sleep-out experience**, where you can **sleep under the stars on a machaan (raised platform)**, fully immersed in nature. The camp provides a deep dive into **conservation efforts and the cultural heritage of the region**.

Mornings begin with tea or coffee, **followed by a sunrise safari**, guided by **expert naturalists**. In addition to **mid-afternoon safaris**, you can opt for **night safaris and guided nature walks**, offering a chance to **spot nocturnal species**. The camp's **expert guides** provide in-depth knowledge of **Pench's rich biodiversity** and the role of **community conservation** in protecting India's wilderness.

Mar 9 ~ Return to Delhi

After a **final full morning game drive**, return to **Delhi**, where you can relax and reflect on your incredible **wildlife expedition** through India's premier national parks.

Mar 10 ~ Depart for home or join our [Taj Mahal Extension](#).

Mar 11 ~ Arrive home or enjoy the Taj.

- Transfers on February 25 from the Delhi Airport to the Claridges and on March 11 from the Andaz to the Delhi Airport.

- Carbon offsets for your flights to/from this trip.
- All airfare (except flights listed as included), airport and departure taxes, and excess baggage fees. Round-trip airfare is approximately \$1,200 to \$1,400 between the US and Delhi, depending on origin.
- Passport and visa fees.
- Divergent airport transfers (arranged by us) and extra hotel nights.
- Gratuities – tipping is always discretionary. However, we will add a gratuity of \$420 per participant (\$30 per participant per day for February 25 to Mar 10) to your final payment.
- Items of a personal nature such as laundry, telephone calls, medical costs or hospitalization, room service, alcoholic and other beverages, items not on the regular menu, etc. If you have special dietary needs, please indicate them on your Traveler Form.
