SAFARI OVERVIEW

Discover **Madagascar's** cultural richness and astonishing biodiversity on a journey that weaves together **iconic landscapes**, rare wildlife, and meaningful conservation. Begin in **Antananarivo's** historic highlands before exploring the **spiny forests** of the south, where **Berenty Private Reserve** offers exceptional **lemur photography** and insight into Antandroy traditions. Travel onward into lush eastern rainforests in search of the **indri**—the island's largest and most hauntingly vocal lemur—then continue north to experience Madagascar's remarkable ecological variety. From **volcanic forests** and **limestone massifs** to innovative conservation hubs like **Black Lemur Camp**, you'll encounter endangered species including **Perrier's and Tattersall's sifakas**, with opportunities to seek out the elusive **aye-aye** on guided night walks. This immersive adventure highlights Madagascar's most compelling natural and cultural treasures, offering a deep connection to one of the world's most extraordinary biodiversity hotspots.

DETAILED ITINERARY

April 23–24 ~ Travel to Antananarivo, Madagascar

April 25 ~ Arrive in Antananarivo

Meet your local team and proceed to the hotel for an overnight stay.

April 26 ~ Explore Antananarivo

Enjoy a relaxed morning with a coffee talk led by your Malagasy tour leader for a general introduction and information briefing. Subsequently, take a leisurely sightseeing tour of the old town, exploring the Queen's Palace perched atop the hill. This stroll provides insights into Madagascar's colonial history, blending past and present. By midday, visit the Musée de la Photo and indulge in the exquisite cuisine of the Café du Musée Restaurant. This sightseeing adventure continues as you gradually drive back to your hotel for a well-deserved and restful night.

Due to the logistical realities of traveling in Madagascar, internal flight schedules can change unexpectedly, which may require adjustments to the order or timing of our planned destinations and activities. Flexibility is essential, and any itinerary updates will be made to ensure a smooth experience while preserving the quality of your wildlife and cultural encounters.

Apr 27 ~ Travel to Fort Dauphin

With an extremely early morning flight, you will arrive in Fort Dauphin and be transferred to the hotel to sleep before enjoying breakfast and sightseeing while discovering the city's past and current history. Taolagnaro's historical remnants prove fascinating with the port city preserving volumes of books reflecting Madagascar's pre-colonial life. After lunch, you will continue to either Nahampoana or Saiadi reserve to observe mesmerizing wildlife.

Apr 28 ~ Drive to Berenty Reserve

Journey to the remarkable Berenty Reserve. The drive unfolds incredible life and nature scenery with 60 miles of ever-changing vegetation. As you approach the mighty Mandrare River and its expansive sisal plantation, the varying landscape guides you to Berenty, the distinctive home of the dancing lemur. Lemurs abound here; their curious eyes follow your every move.

Apr 29–30 ~ Exploration of Berenty Reserve

The Berenty Lodge boasts an unparalleled location at the heart of the lemurs' habitat. The reserve encompasses two primary forest habitats: one featuring one of the country's few remaining tamarind gallery forests and the other showcasing the native spiny forest. Home to five different lemur species, including the energetic dancing sifaka and the globally renowned ring-tailed lemur, Berenty provides the ideal setting for spectacular lemur photography.

Imagine day walks within the gallery forest and night excursions through the spiny forest where lemurs skillfully navigate from tree to tree. Renowned for its diverse birdlife, yet the richness extends beyond animals and plants, the local Antandroy people, inhabitants of the spiny bushes, hold incredible life stories and traditions they are eager to share. Their presence is a testament to the harmonious coexistence of nature and humanity, illustrating a perfect balance between socio-economic survival and nature conservation.

May 1 ~ Andohahela National Park and Taolagnaro

Embarking on an early morning departure, you will savor the sunrise by the Mandrare River bridge. The progressing sunlight paints a mesmerizing scene as life unfolds along the riverbanks. Continuing off-road, your journey takes you to Anony Lake, surrounded by spectacular sand dunes hosting groups of pink flamingos and various water birds, creating a picturesque landscape.

The region between the Anosy (seashore) and the Androy (land of spikes) unfolds a dramatic panorama, featuring cliff-ranged rainforest mountains, dense spiny bushes, spiny forest, and transitional forests. Your exploration continues with a walk within the Andohahela National Park, where you will encounter the Ankazofotsy forest and its blooming pachypodium, towering triangle palms, and nocturnal lemurs nestled in their tree holes. You should arrive back in Fort Dauphin just before sunset.

May 2 ~ Lokaro Bay and Return to Antananarivo

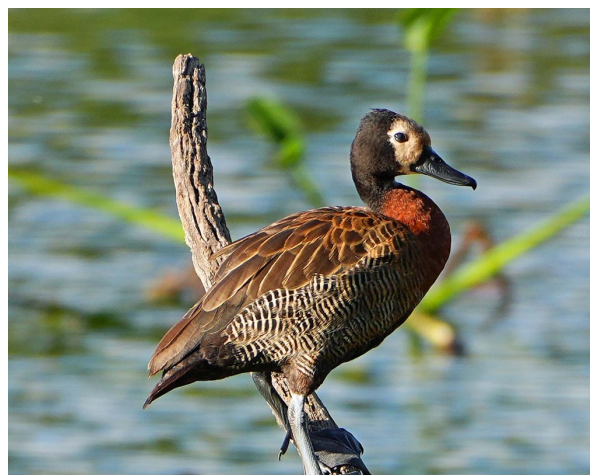
Spend the first half of the day on a boat excursion from Lanirano Lake to Lokaro Bay, 25 miles from Fort Dauphin; these painted shores offer incredible views. Navigate through channels passing marshy vegetation filled with arums, pandanus trees, and the distinctive Ravinala. Keep an eye out for wild ducks and kingfishers darting through the greenery as local fishermen stick to the coastline in handcrafted canoes. After the boat ride, you'll depart the southeastern part of Madagascar and its awe-inspiring Anosy cliff-range mountains and fly back to Antananarivo for an overnight and a group dinner at one of Madagascar's top-rated restaurants.

May 3 ~ Travel to Andasibe and Reptile Park

Depart for the Andasibe Rain Forest. The drive along winding hilly roads is not just scenic, it unveils the absorbing livelihoods of the central highlanders, showcasing their agricultural plots and livestock. It's also an opportunity to witness the ongoing challenges faced by Madagascar's biodiversity in the face of anthropic actions.

Make a stop on the way to the captivating reptile park of Peyreiras. This sanctuary offers a close-up encounter with species that are challenging to find in the wild. Reptile and amphibian enthusiasts will discover a paradise with the world's largest chameleon and the world's largest moth. Continue the drive and settle into the hotel, enjoying the symphony of the rainforest around you.

May 4–5 ~ Andasibe Rain Forest

Andasibe is an award-winning rainforest teeming with natural wonders for passionate wildlife enthusiasts, captivating visitors with its diverse fauna and flora, and offering a variety of hikes. It is renowned for its special reserve of indri, the star inhabitant with its large white and black body and haunting call that resonates through the entire forest. Over these two days, you will explore at least four different parks and reserves in the area and gain a deeper understanding of Madagascar's ecosystems.

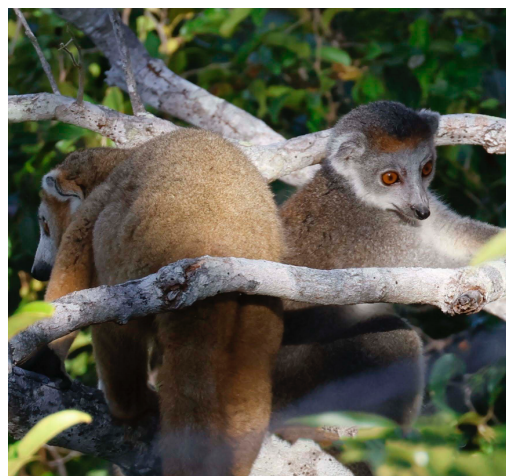
Mantadia National Park features diverse wild and pristine lodges, allowing you to observe the same species of lemurs in different habitats. This exploration also provides opportunities to discover more species of reptiles, amphibians, birds, and beyond. With the VOI community-based park offering an intriguing forest night walk, and the Vakona private reserve with its "Lemur Island," you'll be thoroughly immersed in the field of biodiversity.

May 6 ~ Return to Antananarivo

Wake up listening to the Indri singing then enjoy one last visit to Lemur Island and a final walk through Andasibe before beginning the journey back to Antananarivo.

May 7 ~ Travel to Ankarana National Park

Hop an early morning flight to Diego Suarez in the far northern city of the island. Upon arrival, board your vehicles for a direct journey towards the Ankarana region. Venture into the distinctive landscape of the Tsingy kingdom within Ankarana National Park. Explore the enchanting east side of Ankarana discovering its hidden wildlife amidst limestone forests, grottos, and deciduous dry forests. Witness lemurs in the treetops, nesting birds, and camouflaged reptiles. Highlights include the Ankarana sportive lemur, northern sportive lemur, northern bamboo lemur, crowned lemur, and Sanford brown lemur. Marvel at exceptional reptile species like Paroedura geckos, the giant green-day gecko, golden hog-nosed snake, and other colubrid snakes.

In the mid-afternoon, travel to the west side of Ankarana, where the Iharana Bush Camp lies in the cultural cradle of the Antakarana ethnic group. Enjoy captivating sunsets and rejuvenating sunrise moments in this spectacular haven.

May 8 ~ Ankarana West and possibly Daraina Reserve

Today you will choose from various on-site activities or embark on a captivating 2-hour drive to Daraina. Special day and night walks offer a unique encounter with Madagascar's critically endangered lemur, the white Tattersall's sifaka, and the fascinating aye-aye, the most peculiar of all lemurs. Daraina's dry forest hosts other locally or regionally restricted species, making it a must-visit for nature enthusiasts.

May 9 ~ Travel to Anjahakely Forest

Depart Iharana Bush Camp and head towards the Andrafiarana/Andavakoera region and the secluded Anjahakely protected area. Along the scenic drive, witness captivating landscapes—limestone rocks adorned with dry deciduous vegetation, volcanic ash cones, mountain rainforests, and picturesque rice paddies.

Diverge from the main road, traversing grassy hills until reaching the Anjahakely forest, home to the well-nested Black Lemur Camp. Begin with a general briefing, then relax for a bit before for a night walk featuring nocturnal mouse lemurs, captivating chameleons, intriguing leaf-tailed geckos, birds, and more.

May 10 ~ Exploring Black Lemur Camp

Explore the habitat of the critically endangered black sifaka lemur, a strictly endemic species and one of the world's 25 most endangered mammals. Two-thirds of Perrier's sifaka are exclusive to the Andrafiarana/Andavakoera area. Discover various attractions, including vanga birds, hawks, and Petter's chameleon with its distinctive nose-horns and the striking red patch on mature females' heads. Another night walk awaits the adventurous. By staying at Black Lemur Camp, you contribute to the protection of this unique area and support the local community, including the lodge staff.

May 11 ~ Return to Diego Suarez

Following an early breakfast, drive back to the city of Diego Suarez. Along the way, encounter another masterpiece of nature: the breathtaking Tsingy Rouge (Red Tsingy), where Madagascar Buzzards and Yellow-Billed Kites gracefully soar above, and Olive Bee-eaters add a vibrant contrast to the delicate red eroded soil.

You'll also have time to stop at the commanding Montagne des Français Reserve. This Reserve is a protected area overseeing the expansive Bay of Diego and its iconic loaf-shaped rock. The mountain is adorned with remarkable plant life, featuring the strictly endemic Suarez's baobab and the region's native aloe. Arrive at your hotel in time to enjoy the sunset from the remarkable views.

May 12 ~ Montagne D'Ambre National Park

Spend the full day exploring Montagne d'Ambre National Park, a haven where rainforest blankets the entire area. This verdant and evergreen protected forest, one of the country's most humid, fosters an opulent evolution of wildlife. Witness an extraordinary array of leaf-tailed geckos (including 6 different species), the diminutive Brookesia tuberculata chameleon, native carnivores, and an array of Madagascar's iconic lemurs,

each ready to showcase their beauty. You'll also take a night walk, enhancing your opportunities to capture the untamed beauty of this natural masterpiece through your lenses and eyes.

May 13 ~ Flight back to Antananarivo

Take in the beautiful colonial city of Diego Suarez one last time before heading to the airport after lunch for your flight back to Antananarivo.

May 14 ~ Depart for home

Spend your final morning in Madagascar relaxing and perusing local vendors at the hotel before transferring to the airport for your international flights home.

May 15 ~ Arrive Home

Climate

Late April/May marks the beginning of the dry season. Afternoons are pleasant with temperatures reaching 75°F (24°C), but evenings and early mornings are cooler with temperatures around 55°F (13°C).

Fitness Level

This Madagascar tour requires a reasonable level of fitness, and you should be in good general health. Most of the wildlife viewing and birding is done on foot and may require walking for several hours; locating some of the endemic species may require a few longer walks. A few forest trails can be steep and slippery, especially after rain. We strive to spend maximum time in nature, and days are long and demanding, though you have some flexibility to opt out of certain activities. Please contact us if you have any health concerns that may make this trip challenging.
